Assignment for webinar 1: write a short research note of two pages (maximum 1.500 words) outlining your research project and answering these specific questions. <u>N.B.</u> References are not required for this research note, but if you would choose to add them, they are not included in the word limit mentioned above.

- What is the historical problem you will address in your conference paper/talk?
- What is the historiographical tradition in which you can embed your conference paper/talk?
- What are your main questions and hypotheses?
- Regarding sources and methods, how will you answer these questions, and verify/falsify your hypotheses?
- What is the main point you want the audience to take away from your conference paper/talk and why does it matter? What is the (societal and scientific) relevance of your (preliminary) findings?
