## WEBINAR 1

Date: **Wednesday May 7, 2pm-4.30pm (CEST)**

Assignment for webinar 1: write a short research note of two pages (maximum 1.500 words) outlining your research project and answering these specific questions. N.B. References are not required for this research note, but if you would choose to add them, they are not included in the word limit mentioned above.

- What is the historical problem you will address in your conference paper/talk?
- What is the historiographical tradition in which you can embed your conference paper/talk?
- What are your main questions and hypotheses?
- Regarding sources and methods, how will you answer these questions, and verify/falsify your hypotheses?
- What is the main point you want the audience to take away from your conference paper/talk and why does it matter? What is the (societal and scientific) relevance of your (preliminary) findings?
